Code of Conduct

This Code of Conduct is issued by the WWI committee, is binding on all members and is a condition of using the club rooms and equipment.

Waverley Woodworkers Code of Conduct

This Code of Conduct outlines the standards of behaviour expected from all members of Waverley Woodworkers to ensure a safe, respectful, and inclusive environment for everyone. All members, volunteers, and visitors are required to follow these guidelines while on club premises or participating in any club activities.

1. Respect for the law

- Our Club's workshop is located on City of Monash council property and is subject to council's bylaws and regulations
- WWI members are required to comply with the statutes and regulations of the City of Monash and the rules of Waverley Woodworkers Inc.

2. Safety First

Safety is the top priority in all woodworking activities. Members must:

- Adhere to all safety guidelines and procedures set by the club.
- Use personal protective equipment (PPE) such as safety glasses, hearing protection, and dust masks when required.
- Report any malfunctioning equipment or hazards immediately.
- Ensure machinery is used correctly and responsibly.
- Never use tools or equipment without proper training and supervision.
- Keep the workshop clean, organized, and free of hazards to prevent accidents.
- Be aware of first aid equipment and emergency procedures in case of accidents.
- Avoid the use of alcohol, drugs, or any substance that may impair judgment or coordination while in the workshop, operating machinery or engaged in any club activity.

3. Respectful and Inclusive Environment

The club aims to create a welcoming atmosphere where all individuals feel respected and valued. Members must:

- Treat fellow members and visitors with courtesy and respect at all times.
- Avoid offensive, discriminatory, or abusive language or behaviour.
- Respect individual differences and be mindful of diverse cultural backgrounds and skill levels.
- Foster an environment of inclusivity, where all members, regardless of gender, race, age, or ability, feel encouraged and supported.
- Engage in constructive feedback when helping others improve their woodworking skills.

4. Care and Respect for Equipment

The club provides equipment and tools for shared use. Members must:

• Treat all tools, machinery, and equipment with care and respect.

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- Clean and store tools properly after use, ensuring they are ready for the next user.
- Report any damage to tools or machinery immediately.
- Refrain from using tools for purposes they are not designed for.

5. Workshop Etiquette

To maintain a cooperative and efficient workshop environment, members must:

- Share workspaces and equipment fairly, allowing equal access for all members.
- Not interfere with another member while they are working on a machine.
- Minimize noise and disruption when working in shared spaces.
- Communicate clearly when others are using tools nearby, to prevent accidents.
- Respect time limits on machinery and workstations, especially during busy periods.
- Clean up after themselves, ensuring their work area is tidy for the next member.

6. Project Ownership and Club Property

Members should be mindful of the ownership of projects and club resources:

- Respect other members' projects and do not handle or use them without permission.
- Label personal materials and store them properly in designated areas.
- Do not use club materials or resources for personal use unless approved.

7. Conflicts and Disputes

Disputes may arise, but they must be resolved in a constructive and respectful manner. Members must:

- Approach conflicts calmly and respectfully, seeking to resolve issues through discussion.
- If conflicts cannot be resolved, bring the matter to the attention of the duty member or committee member.
- Refrain from physical or verbal aggression under any circumstances.

8. Health and Hygiene

Maintaining a clean and healthy workshop is important for everyone's well-being. Members must:

- Ensure proper ventilation is maintained when working with dust-producing machinery or toxic chemicals.
- Dispose of waste materials properly, especially hazardous substances like solvents or adhesives.
- Ensure all work areas are left clean and tidy after use.

9. Compliance with Club Rules and Regulations

All members are expected to:

- Follow the rules, policies, and procedures set by the club.
- Respect the decisions made by the committee or duty members regarding the operation of the club and use of resources.
- Keep their membership dues up to date and adhere to club schedules for opening hours and events.

10. Consequences of Violations

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Violations of the Code of Conduct will be addressed promptly and fairly by the committee. Possible actions include:

- Verbal or written warnings for minor violations.
- Temporary suspension of membership privileges for more serious offenses.
- Permanent revocation of membership for repeated or severe violations, including unsafe behaviour, disrespect towards others, or intentional damage to property.

11. Acknowledgment

By joining Waverley Woodworkers, all members agree to abide by this Code of Conduct. Failure to comply with the guidelines may result in disciplinary actions as outlined above.
